# Hawaii Right To Life Candidate Questionnaire

## General Election – November 7, 2006

HAWAII LEGISLATURE (First 3 Questions immediately below)  
U.S.SENATE / HOUSE (All 4 Questions below)

### Question 1

Will you vote AGAINST legislation that would legalize assisted suicide in Hawaii or the United States? YES / NO

### Question 2

Which of the following statements most clearly describes your own position on the issue of abortion?

- Abortion should be prohibited in all circumstances.
- Abortion should be prohibited except to save the life of the mother.
- Abortion should be prohibited except in cases of rape, incest, or to save the life of the mother.
- Abortion should be legal for any reason but not after the first three months of pregnancy.
- Abortion should be legal for any reason but not after the first six months of pregnancy.
- Abortion should be legal at any time during a woman's pregnancy.

### Question 3

Laws are in effect in 29 states requiring notification or consent of at least one parent (or authorization by a judge) before an abortion can be performed on a minor. Our nation does not have an effective parental involvement law. Would you SUPPORT and VOTE for a bill that would require parental involvement prior to a minor obtaining an abortion in Hawaii or the United States? YES / NO

### Question 4

Medical researchers have determined that before the end of the fifth month of pregnancy, unborn babies already have all the parts of the nervous system that enable them to feel excruciating pain when they are torn apart and stabbed during abortions. A bill under consideration in Congress, the Unborn Child Pain Awareness Act (S. 51, H.R. 356), would require that any woman who seeks an abortion after this point must first be given accurate information about the capacity of her unborn child to experience pain. The bill would also require the mother to sign a form saying whether she wants to go forward with the abortion, and whether she will agree to have pain-reducing drugs given to her unborn baby.

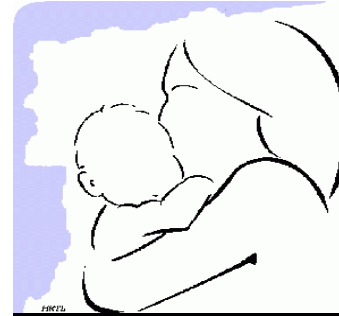

Also listed is the voting record of all incumbents at the State level who voted on codifying "Roe vs. Wade" (HB1242) and allowing homeless minor girls to have abortions in Hawaii (SB2166), whether they returned the survey or not.

Take special note of those candidates listed who are running for office from your district(s) of residence to see how they responded to our questions. We encourage you to call those candidates running in your district who chose not to respond to our survey to determine their positions on the questions posed.

Use the information about the positions of the various candidates to help yourself make an informed decision when you vote in the November 7<sup>th</sup> General election.
